

Scandinavia Tour Itinerary

The first step to roaming around Scandinavia is booking flights and hotels. Once you arrive, your itinerary is as follows:

Day 1: Copenhagen, Denmark

Begin your day in the charming city of Copenhagen, the capital of Denmark. Start with a visit to the iconic Little Mermaid statue, inspired by the fairytale by Hans Christian Andersen.

In the evening, head to the trendy Södermalm neighborhood for dinner and drinks.

Day 4: Helsinki, Finland

Catch an early morning ferry from Stockholm to Helsinki, the capital of Finland.

Next, visit the Temppeliaukio Church, or Rock Church, a unique church built into solid rock.

In the evening, head to the bustling district of Kallio for dinner and drinks.
